



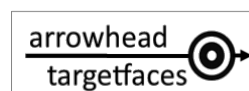
# BRITISH FIELD ARCHERY CHAMPIONSHIPS



<b>Location</b>	The Warren and Peter Hastings Woods, White Hill, Kingsclere, Hampshire On Fox's Lane between Kingsclere and Sydmonton. <a href="#">///position.firework.hangs</a> <b><i>Farm entrance is DIFFERENT to our normal competitions, please see map</i></b>
<b>Dates</b>	<b>25<sup>th</sup> &amp; 26<sup>th</sup> May 2024</b>
<b>Entry</b>	Tickets via Sport80 at £42 for adults and £32 for juniors, single day entry is not available.

<b>Registration &amp; Assembly</b>	Registration and equipment inspection from 8:30 am. Assembly <b>10:00 am</b> both days. <b><i>Membership cards or proof of affiliation to World Archery will be required.</i></b>
<b>Round</b>	Sat. WA 24 unmarked, Sun. WA 24 marked
<b>Judges</b>	Chairman: Lee Miller, assisted by: Paul Clarke, Tony Harris, Lorraine Smith, Peter Turner
<b>Practice</b>	Practice targets will be available from 8:00am to 9.45am on Saturday & Sunday. Practice targets may be available on Friday pm, please contact the TO for timings.
<b>Eligibility</b>	The All British Field Archery Championships will be awarded to the highest placed British Archery GB members shooting the recognized categories of American Flatbow, Asiatic, Barebow, Compound Barebow, Compound Limited, Compound Unlimited, Recurve, Longbow, and Traditional as defined by Archery GB.  The Open Championships are open to all archers who are members of a World Archery affiliated body. The recognized categories are Barebow, Compound and Recurve.
<b>Home Nations</b>	This event will host the Home Nations match, awards to be decided and awarded by the Home nations.
<b>Senior Awards</b>	<b>National Trophies:</b> Will be awarded to the highest placed archer holding, or eligible to hold a British passport. Archery GB regret that Open or British trophies cannot be taken outside the United Kingdom. Medals will be awarded in all categories according to the number of entries: 2 – 3 entries = 1 medal. 4 – 7 entries = 2 medals. 8 or more entries = 3 medals.  <b>Arrowhead awards:</b> All classes and age groups must shoot as follows: Barebow – Blue pegs, Compound and Recurve – Red pegs.  <b>50+:</b> Additional medals will be given to senior entrants that are over 50.
<b>Juniors shooting as seniors</b>	Juniors over the age of 12 are welcome to shoot on an equal footing with senior archers and compete for the senior titles, but must enter and pay as seniors.
<b>Junior Awards</b>	Age is the age of the archer on the <b>31<sup>st</sup> December 2024</b> (i.e. after their 2024 birthday) Awards will be awarded to Archers shooting in the following age group/peg combinations:  <b>With sights (CUL, CL, Rec):</b> Red: U18, Blue: U16, Yellow: U15, White: U14/U12 <b>Without sights (AFB, Asiatic, BB, CBB, LB, Trad):</b> Blue: U18, Yellow: U16, White: U15/U14/U12

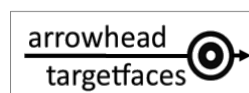

	<p>Medals will be awarded in all categories according to the number of entries: 1 – 2 entries = 1 medal. 3 – 6 entries = 2 medals. 7 or more entries = 3 medals</p> <p>Experienced archers in the U16, U15, U14 and U12 age groups may enter in an age group above their own and shoot from the appropriate pegs for that group (and will compete for the award in that group).</p> <p>For example, the U14 age group championship for recurve is contested over white peg distances. If an U14 recurve wishes to shoot the yellow peg, they will effectively be in the U15 category, as there is no yellow peg category for U14 recurves.</p> <p>The Junior All British Field Archery Championship titles, Championship medals and trophies (where applicable) will be awarded to archers in the U18 category shooting the adult distances for their gender and bow type. Age group championships will be awarded trophies (where applicable), medals and the title of 'Junior All British (age-group/bowstyle) Field Archery Champion'.</p>
<b>Junior Entrants</b>	Please email the Tournament Organiser to confirm shooting group arrangements. Juniors should shoot with a nominated senior archer as their guardian for the day.
<b>Dog Policy</b>	The only dogs allowed on the course during the event will be Assistance dogs, as per AGB "Dogs at Competitions and Events", January 2024: <a href="https://archerygb.org/files/archery-gb-dogs-at-competitions-and-events-guidance-150224135633.pdf">https://archerygb.org/files/archery-gb-dogs-at-competitions-and-events-guidance-150224135633.pdf</a>
<b>GDPR</b>	By entering this tournament, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament Organiser, Archery GB and other competitors. Some information may also be published in documents or lists relating to the event at a schedule decided by the Organiser. These include the entrant's name, gender, age category, email addresses and/or contact numbers provided, club, county and any assigned codes for this information.
<b>Refreshments</b>	On both days, breakfast rolls, lunch burgers, sausage etc. Hot & cold drinks and cakes.
<b>Spectators</b>	Spectators may be allowed on certain parts of the course during the period of competition, but only if escorted and at the discretion of the judges.
<b>Dress</b>	No camouflage. Archers are advised to wear colours which are clearly visible in woodland.
<b>Drug Testing</b>	This record status shoot will be liable for drug testing; competitors approached to give samples must comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Entries from archers under 18 are considered to be approved by a parent/guardian, signifying their consent to their child being drug tested if approached.
<b>Safeguarding</b>	Welfare officers' information will be added to the relevant competition Ianseo page.
