




# Meriden Archery Club Autumn WA 720 & H2H's Saturday 31<sup>st</sup> August 2024

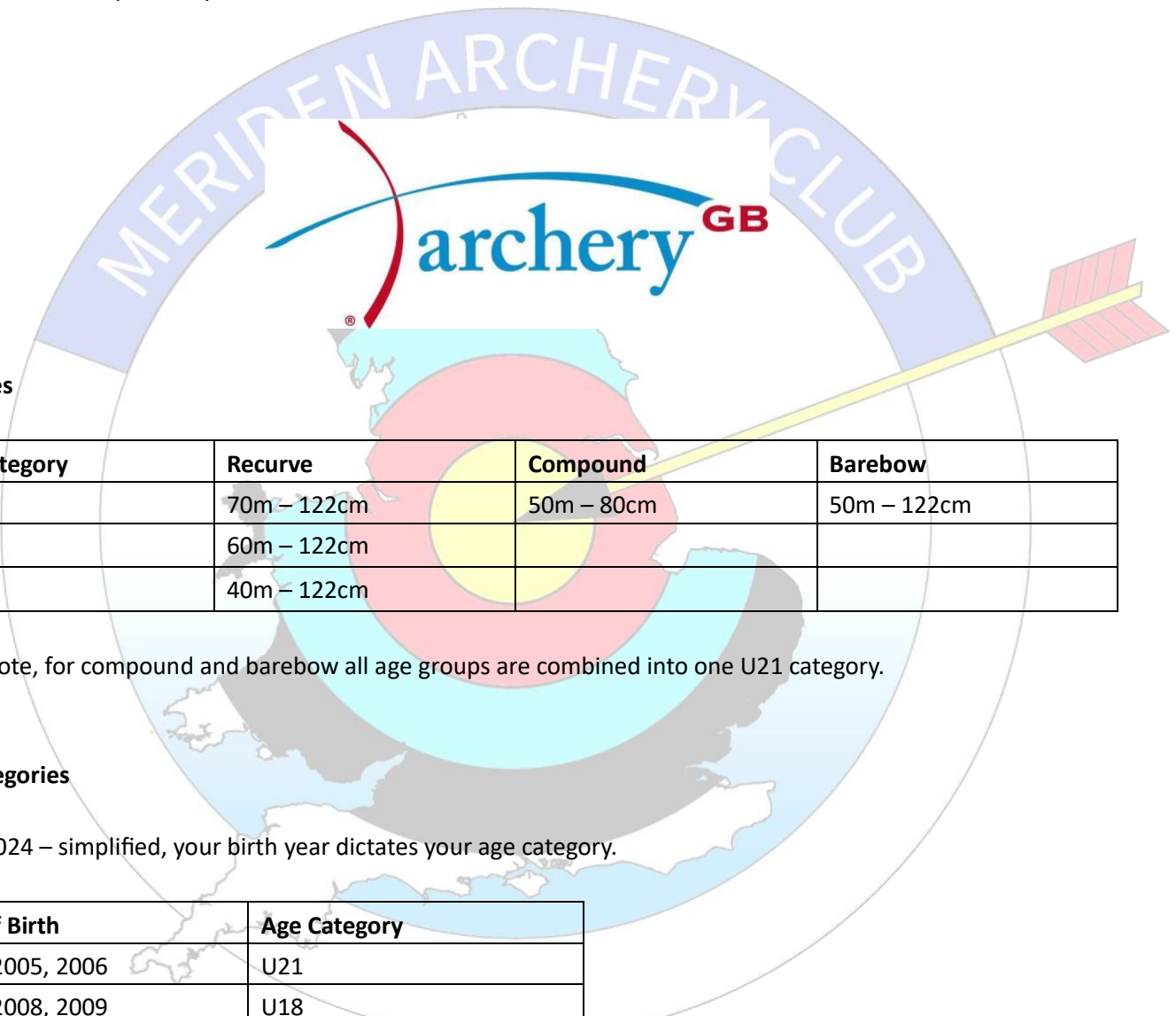


- **Format:**
  - Morning - World Record Status WA 70m, 60m and 40m recurve and 50m compound/barebow round. Compound targets will have one 6-ring face per archer, whilst all other targets will have one 10-ring target face per target.
  - Afternoon - Head-to-head matches in each division
- **Timings:**
  - Strictly no access or entry before 07:30 am
  - Registration from 08:00 – 08:30 am. Proof of AGB membership will be required
  - Equipment inspection: from 08:00 am in front of the Judges hut
  - Assembly: 08:30 am followed by two ends of official practice
- **Judges:** Jo Orbell (CoJ), Susan Richards, Andy Stanford and others tbc
- **Entry & fees:**
  - Entry is open to any archer who has shot at least three of the five stages
  - Entry is via Club Event [Click here to enter](#)
  - Entries open on 31/07/24
    - Entry fee - £20
    - Entries close 25/08/24
    - 80% refund up to and inc. 25/08/24
- **Miscellaneous entry information:**
  - Please state if you have any specific requirements on the entry form
  - Archers who are unable to collect, pull and/or score arrows should bring a helper with them who can do this for them.
- **Divisions:**
  - Recurve, compound and barebow
- **Classes:**
  - Recurve U21, U18, U15 men and women

- Compound and Barebow: men and women “youth” categories combining U21, U18 and U15 age groups
  - See year of birth table below
  - **Awards:**
    - Top three places in each class
  - **Target List and Results:**
    - Target list will be available 48 hours beforehand, and results will be displayed 24 hours after the event on lanseo.
  - **Archery GB Compliance:**
    - Archery GB dress regulations as shown in Rule 307 will apply and is open to any archer currently affiliated to AGB.
  - **Contact:**

  - **Photography:**
    - By entering this competition, you agree that photographs and/or video may be taken at the event. Please contact the TO directly if you do not wish to be included in any photo.
    - Anyone wishing to use video or photographic equipment at this tournament must register prior to the shoot.
  - **Other info:**
    - **Tents** - are permitted and can be put up between 5-7 pm (only) on the day before the competition. Do not pitch over the # area. Overnight camping or practice is not permitted at this time.
    - **Food and Drink** - hot and cold drinks, along with a selection of cold food (cakes, pastries, etc) will be available in the clubhouse from 08:00 am. Please bring your own cup to reduce the waste. Hot food will **not** be provided.
    - **Toilets** - male, female and disabled toilets are provided.
    - **Dogs** - are permitted but must be kept on a lead at all times
    - **Music** - music may be played throughout the event
    - **Smoking** - inc. vapes is only permitted behind the last row of tents
    - **Alcohol** - no alcohol is allowed on the field
    - **Drug testing** - World Record Status shoots are liable for drug testing and any competitors approached to give samples must comply. If they refuse, that refusal will be treated as a positive result. Where an entry form contains junior entries, the parent or guardian must countersign the form to confirm they consent to their child being tested if approached.
    - **Data Protection/GDPR** - by entering the event, you agree that information may be collected and shared with tournament organisers, scoring systems, Archery GB and other
