4.2 AGB will use the 2025 World Youth Championships to prepare youth
talent for a future as a British Olympic/Paralympic archer through exposure
to world class competition.

5. Performance standards

- 5.1 Minimum qualifying scores (MQS) have been set for AGB to consider inviting athletes into the selection process.
- 5.2 The MQS on a WA70/WA60 round are:

- 5.3 Scores must be shot at World Record Status (WRS) events within the selection window see section 7. Details of how scores need to be submitted can be found in Appendix A.
- 5.4 Young athletes' performance can improve quickly. Archery GB reserves the right, but are under no obligation, to invite further athletes into the selection process if they can demonstrate competitive performance after the relevant score submission deadline.

6. Selection process

- 6.1 The intent of the Selection Shoot process is to give athletes the opportunity to demonstrate their performance level within a series of formats that replicate the demands of international competition.
- 6.2 A selection shoot will take place at Lilleshall National Sports Centre on 31 May and 1 June 2025. This event coincides with the senior selection shoot on the same dates and athletes can participate in both processes concurrently. A full rationale can be found in Appendix B.
- 6.3 Athletes are responsible for entering the selection shoot through Sport 80 and payment of the appropriate entry fee.
- 6.4 The selection shoot format will be as follows

- 6.5 Timings for shooting will be as follows:
- 6.5.1 720: 30 seconds per arrow, 180 seconds per end
- 6.5.2 Matches: 30 seconds per arrow, 90 seconds per end
- 6.6 The following data will be recorded at each stage of the selection shoot process:

- 6.7 The final number of head-to-head matches to be shot per category will be confirmed when the number of athletes in each category is confirmed. Athletes may shoot one or more complete round robins in their category.
- 6.8 The total points accrued during the selection shoot will be added together and a ranking table created. These results will be used by the selection panel, alongside the other factors identified in section 8.3 when considering final selections and nominations.
- 6.9 In the event of multiple athletes accruing the same number of overall points following the selection shoot, ties will be decided based on the number of match wins throughout the selection shoot. If multiple

athletes are still tied, final ranking of these athletes will be determined based on the cumulative total of their 720 scores at the selection shoot. European Youth Cup 2^{nd} leg (6.10 - 6.11)6.10 Subject to sufficient athletes, the top three athletes per category will be selected for the European Youth Cup 1st leg on the sum of their total points accrued at the selection shoot. 6.11 Any further selection will be subject to the selection panel's discretion. World Youth Championships (6.12 – 6.14) 6.12 Subject to sufficient athletes, the top two athletes per category will be selected for the World Youth Championships on the sum of their total points accrued at the selection shoot (subject to 6.13 below). 6.13 If an athlete who finishes in the top two has not achieved the relevant MQS to attend the World Youth Championships (Band A or B), they will not be eligible for selection for this event. This does not change the ranking order or the number of automatically selected places. 6.14 Any further selection will be subject to the selection panel's discretion. 6.15 Athletes are required to complete all stages of the selection shoot process to be eligible for selection for either event. Should an athlete not be able to participate in part of the selection process due to illness, injury or other international representation, they will need approved medical or programme exemption from Archery GB personnel. Further consideration of this athlete will be done in line with criteria herein. 7.1 The selection window for attainment of MQS for the both the European 7. Team announcement	injury/illness or any other unforeseen circumstances, maintenance of form and fitness, performance readiness, performance potential, medal target, performance pedigree (including international medals won), injury/illness history, behaviour and contribution to a team ethos. 9.1 Athletes selected will be notified within 24 hours of the selection panel meeting and the team announcement will take place within seven days of the selection panel meeting. 9.2 Selected team members must agree not to make any announcement to the media or public in any form (including on any social or other media) regarding their selection until after Archery GB have announced the selection on the Archery GB website www.archerygb.org

	 11.2 All selected athletes must declare any medications they are taking, in particular the use of any restricted medications and that they hold a valid Therapeutic Use Exemption (TUE) which can be produced when required by the relevant authority; 11.3 An athlete and other team members will be required to sign up to the relevant Code of Conduct or Athlete Agreement and any breach of this may result in disciplinary action including removal from the team and possible early return home from an event. In this case any member sent home will be invoiced for the full cost of their entry into the event and any additional cost incurred in sending them home. Decisions on these matters are open to appeal as allowed by the relevant Archery GB Disciplinary process effective at the time of the incident.
	11.4 Athletes and other team members selected, are required to attend all related training camps and competitions as laid out by the Acting Performance Pathway Manager from the selection announcement onwards;
	11.5 Athletes and other team members will be expected to demonstrate they can actively contribute to the team unity required to be a successful international team and will be required to maintain or improve standards and behaviours to participate for Archery GB.

Appendix A

Registration and performance tracking

- 14.1 Athletes can register three scores achieved in WA70/WA60 rounds in an online score tracking system. Click here to access the score submission form: https://forms.office.com/e/4tg3iiSEu6
- 14.2 Scores must have been achieved at World Record Status competition and evidence of the score must be provided.
- 14.3 Athletes can register up to six scores in one entry but may register as many entries as they wish.
- 14.4 It is the athlete's sole responsibility to ensure they register their scores and that those scores have been accepted onto that system.
- 14.5 Registration on this tracking system will automatically be taken as an expression of interest for entry to the selection process.
- 14.6 This system will allow athletes to retrospectively add their scores achieved during the score window outlined in 7.1, which is compulsory for consideration.
- 14.7 Athletes must have registered their scores by the deadline outlined in 7.2.
- 14.8 Archery GB also reserves the right to take into consideration other aspects, including athlete conduct and previous performances, when considering invitations to the selection process. It is not

an athlete's right under any circumstances to be invited. Where other elements are taken into account, the athlete has a right to be given the explanation as well as a right to appeal.

Appendix B

Process rationale: Incorporation of Senior Selection Process in 2025 Youth Recurve Selection Process

- 15.1 The 2025 Youth and Senior Selection shoots will be incorporated into the same dates and follow the same process.
- 15.2 Archery GB is conscious of the supporting role it has in contributing to optimising physical and mental wellbeing of young athletes on the Performance Pathway. This contribution is elevated around times of pressure, transition and competition. By amalgamating selection shoots, we aim to minimise competing commitments for athletes targeting both processes and to optimise scheduling within an extremely busy competition calendar.

Appendix C

Funding available for events

- 15.3 Archery GB believes that it is important that attendance at youth internationals should be based on performance merit, not financial ability. Notwithstanding, Archery GB does not have funding to pay for every athlete, staff and support resource at all international events and therefore carefully considers which events it will use programme funding for, and which events are required to be self-funded by athletes.
- 15.4 In recent years, the cost of attending internationals events has increased whilst overall funding levels have remained stable or gone down.
- 15.5 Archery GB has chosen to target two youth international events in 2025 as these represent different development and performance opportunities for young athletes. The World Youth Championships in particular is expected to be a costly event due to its location.
- 15.6 In line with the funding outlined in section 1, these events will be both funded and self-funded. For the World Youth Championships, the level of funding available towards a place will be determined by an athlete's demonstration of potential to perform strongly at the event (determined by the tier of MQS achieved). Archery GB will publish full guidance on the funding available at each tier prior to the relevant selection shoot so that athletes can make an informed decision about their potential selection.
