1.	Context and aim	1.1. Archery GB are responsible for administering the selection process for the Paralympic Games on
	of event selection	behalf of the British Paralympic Association (BPA). The process herewith enables the nomination of athletes
		to the BPA who ratify final selection against their Qualification and Selection Strategy, the primary focus of
		which is to endorse 'athletes who show demonstrable medal potential at this Games or the next'.
		1.2. The 2024 Paris Paralympics is Archery GB's key milestone event for the Paris cycle and builds upon
		the open selection process held in 2022 for the Para European Championships and 2023 for the Para World
		Championships. The aim of this selection policy is to select a team that maximises medal opportunities in
		individual and team events at the Paralympic Games.

	4.3. International Competitiveness – performances and results at international competition within the
	4-year Paris cycle (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024) including but not limited to whether athletes won quota
	spots and evidence of achieving Performance Zone scores (appendix 2) in their respective category.
	4.4. Future Potential – positive performance trajectory and history over the past 4-year Paris cycle (2021,
	2022, 2023, 2024) that demonstrates medal potential at this Games or the next. Consideration will
	be first given to international trajectory, followed by domestic trajectory and then performances at
	the performance opportunities
5. Selection Process	5.1. The selection process will be made up of 2 stages.
	5.2. Selection Stage 1: Athletes wishing to be considered for selection are required to achieve the
	following <u>minimum selection requirements</u> :
	5.2.1. Minimum event attendance
	5.2.2. Achieve Enhanced Minimum Qualification Score (EMQS)
	5.3. Selection Stage 2: In categories where there are more athletes who have satisfied the minimum
	selection requirements in Selection Stage 1 and met the selection criteria (section 4) than there are
	quota spots available, a selection shoot will be held
	6.1. The window for obtaining the minimum event attendance and EMQS is 1 st April 2023 – 1 st October

7. Selection Stage 1	Minimum event attendance:
	7.1. To demonstrate an ability to compete in different environments and to self-manage in a variety of
	conditions over prolonged periods, athletes must complete* a minimum of 3 separate domestic or
	international WA50m / 70m WRS events** during the selection window.
	7.1.1. *complete – you must complete the event you have entered – i.e., if it is a double 720 then
	you must finish both 720's. If the event you have entered only has appropriate rounds on one
	day (i.e., a 1440 on the second day) you just need to complete the full day of the relevant 720(s)
	&/or H2H's
	7.1.2. **event – all of the competition elements being held at one venue. E.g., competitions holding
	a 720 & H2H's one day and a double 720 the other is still classed as one event if held at the
	same venue, even if national ranking levels differ.

		9.3. Anyone who has medalled or won a quota spot at either the 2023 Para Worlds or 2023 Para
		European Championships will be automatically considered.

		9.4. If there are then spots remaining in any categories, the selection panel will consider athletes who
		have a realistic and achievable chance of winning quota spots in the FQT process and have
		demonstrable medal potential at these games or next. This will be determined by the following criteria:
		9.4.1. International Pedigree – demonstrable medal potential, based on a proven ability to win
		international medals within the 4-year Paris cycle (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024)
		9.4.2. International Competitiveness – performances and results at international level within the 4-
		year Paris cycle (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024) including but not limited to whether athletes won
		quota spots and achievement of performance zone scores (appendix 2) in their respective
		category
		9.4.3. Future Potential – positive performance trajectory and history over the past 4-year Paris cycle
		(2021, 2022, 2023, 2024) that demonstrates medal potential at this Games or the next.

		9.5. Within the wider context and aim of event selection for the Paralympic Games, if the selection panel
		determine there isn't a realistic chance of winning quota spots and / or demonstrable medal
		potential, it may choose not to send full categories.
10). Preparation	10.1. The team selected for the 2024 Paris Paralympic Games, will be automatically selected for the 2024
	events	European Championships and European Cup that form part of the preparation plan for the Games
		in 2024, subject to fitness and performance maintenance
		10.2. In some categories a reserve (section 19) may be selected for the 2024 Paralympic Games to mitigate
		the risk of inury and illness. In such cases, these athletes will also be nominated for selection at the
		European Championships and European Cup.
		10.3. In categories where there are unused places for the European Championships and European Cup,
		additional athletes will be selected at the discretion of the Performance Director against the
		selection criteria in section 4 of the policy.
		10.3.1. Exceptions to 10.3 may be made in the instance of international classification requirements.

	10.4. Within the wider context and aim of event selection for the Paralympic Games, the preparation
	events form a crucial phase of preparation for the Games. In order to maximise preparation and
	focus for the Games, the Performance Director may choose not to send full categories

	11.2. At each stage, the Selection Panel Meetings will follow the process outlined in the respective section
	of the selection policy.
	11.3. The selection panel throughout the process will be made up of the following:
	11.3.1. Performance Director
	11.3.2. Paralympic Programme Manager
	11.3.3. Performance Archery Coaches working in the Paralympic Categories
	11.3.4. Performance Co-Ordinator (Meeting notes)
	11.3.5. Independent performance expert(s)
	11.3.6. BPA representative (Observing at Selection Stage 2 Panel and Final Selection Panel only)
	11.4. In conducting selection at each stage of the process, Archery GB will firstly consider the context and
	aim of event selection, as well as the selection criteria listed in section 4.
	11.5. The panel will also give due consideration to any unforeseen circumstances that may have impacted
	an athlete's ability to meet the minimum selection requirements. In all situations, this will be
	considered within the context of whether they are able to demonstrate the published selection
	criteria (section 4)
	11.6. Following the completion of all stages of the selection process listed in this policy, a final selection
	meeting will take place to review and finalise the nominations to the BPA. In doing so they may also
	consider any other available information, including, but not limited to athletes who have been
	unable to compete due to injury / illness or any other unforeseen circumstances, maintenance of
	form and fitness, adherence to agreed Individual Performance Plan, medal target, injury/illness
	history, behavior and contribution to a team ethos both at the Paralympic Games and within the
	day-to-day environment.
12. Medical Wildcard	12.1. Awarded in exceptional circumstances, for long-term injury / illness / or new medical conditions
	(physical and/or mental), that have impacted an athlete's ability to meet the minimum selection
	requirements.
	12.2. Medical Wildcards that meet the following criteria, would be eligible to be invited into Stage 2 of
	the selection process (section 8)

	12.3.1. Fully unavailable to shoot for 4-6 weeks due to injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental).
	12.3.2. Restricted with same injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental) for more than 3 months
	12.3.3. Has demonstrated an ability to achieve EMQS in the 12 months prior to their injury / illness / medical condition (physical and/or mental).
	12.4. Although the above criteria is a minimum, before a Medical Wildcard is approved, additional consideration would be given as to the time of the season in which the injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental) has taken place and whether or not the injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental) has led to the athlete not having had the same opportunity to compete as everyone else
	12.5. A Medical Wildcard has to have in place a performance readiness plan to demonstrate that they have returned to full fitness and are competitive in the respective category by an agreed date with the Paralympic Programme Manager.
	 12.6. To apply for a medical wildcard athletes must apply in writing to the Paralympic Programme Manager, Rachel Bayley – <u>Rachel.bayley@archerygb.org</u> no later than 1st October 2023. 12.7. Applications must state which of the criteria has been met. Athletes will also need to provide medical evidence to support their application for the AGB medical teams review, who may require further information or access to medical records.
13. Injury/Illness/ Wellbeing	 For any injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental) that occurs during or in the lead up to any selection shoot that is required, and impacts an athlete's ability to complete a selection shoot, the following procedure will be followed:
	 13.2. The injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental) would need to be reported immediately to the AGB approved medical personnel who may request an examination. Further medical clarification may need to be sought from the Chief Medical Officer or other nominated medical personnel. 13.3. A decision will then be made as to whether an athlete is medically withdrawn from the selection shoot.
	 13.4. If an athlete is medically withdrawn from the first selection shoot, the selection panel will consider all available information to determine whether the athlete will be awarded a space at the second selection shoot. This may include, but not be limited to, performance within the selection process up to the point of withdrawal, previous performance pedigree, international competitiveness and future potential (section 4). 13.5. If an athlete is medically withdrawn from the second selection shoot, the selection panel will consider all available information when selecting a team. At any stage following the selection announcement, should there be a doubt over the ability of an athlete to compete to the best of his / her ability due to an injury / illness / medical condition (physical and/or mental), the following procedure will be followed:

b	pe referred to the Archery GB approved medical personnel to undergo a medical examination
t	o determine his / her fitness to participate, which at this stage will be determined based on
а	in assessment of whether or not the injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or
n	nental) is such that the athlete is physically unable to compete or is at risk of causing medical
h	narm to her / himself, or endangering other competitors, officials or spectators.
3.6.2.	If the athlete passes the medical examination but the Medical Personnel and/or Archery GB
h	nave concerns over whether the athlete is able to compete to the best of his / her ability due
t	o the underlying injury / illness / medical conditions (physical and/or mental), the athlete wil
b	e required to undertake an Archery GB agreed Performance Readiness plan, which would
i	nclude Fitness Test(s).
3.6.3.	The Fitness Test(s) will require the athlete to compete under 'controlled competition
C	conditions', as a minimum, in the distance and format which replicates the required
С	competition demands and demonstrate a return to competitiveness. The athlete will be
а	llowed two attempts to satisfy these requirements. If the athlete successfully completes the
f	itness test, they will be required to have in place a performance readiness plan to demonstrate
t	hat they have returned to full fitness and are competitive in the respective category by ar
а	greed date with the Paralympic Programme Manager.
3.6.4.	In the case of any concerns around an athlete's mental health, Archery GB may be required
t	o seek expert advice and input from the EIS Mental Health Expert Panel and / or Paralympics
G	GB's Mental Health Practitioner on the athlete's vulnerability. In certain situations, this may
r	equire the athlete to undergo a mental health assessment either with the CMO, through the
Ν	Aental Health Expert panel or identified external specialist which may include the
c	levelopment of an agreed plan to manage any identified risks and maximise positive menta

	team, from the selection announcement onwards, this includes attendance, in person, at a
	mandatory pre-event medical.
	15.6. Athletes and other Team members will be expected to demonstrate they can actively contribute to
	the team unity required to be a successful international team.

17. Nomination to	17.1. Following the conclusion of the selection process, Archery GB will nominate the athletes to the BPA

	17.2. If the Qualification and Selection Panel does not endorse an athlete nomination, Archery GB, not the
	athlete, are entitled to appeal the decision.
18. The 'Team'	18.1. The 'Team' means the team which is nominated by Archery GB and then selected by the BPA which
	includes athletes, coaches, medical support personnel, team leaders and any associated members
	of the World Class Programme team.
19. Reserves	19.1. In certain categories, a reserve(s) may be identified to mitigate against risks of injury and illness.
	19.2. Any potential reserves would be identified through the selection panel at each phase of the process
	in categories where further places cannot be won. Reserves are not nominated to the BPA unless an
	athlete is deselected and they are then nominated.
	19.3. In selecting a reserve, the panel will consider all available information, including, but not limited to
	medal target, performance pedigree within the Paris cycle (including international medals won),
	future performance potential, injury/illness history, behaviour and contribution to a team ethos
	both at the Paralympic Games and within the day-to-day environment.
	19.4. On a case-by-case basis, identified reserves would be expected to partake in certain elements of the
	Paris Preparation Plan and it would be a condition of acceptance of reserve status that athletes are
	required to maintain an agreed training programme.
	19.5. It is not the expectation that reserves would be identified in all categories and all reserves would be
	'non-travelling'.
20. Announcement	20.1. Selected team members and any identified reserves must agree not to make any announcement to
	the media or public in any form (including on any social or other media) regarding their nomination
	until after ParalympicsGB have announced the selection.
	20.2. The Archery GB Paralympic team will be announced once nominations have been ratified by the
	BPA.
21. Athlete	21.1. Once selections have been confirmed by the Performance Director / Para Programme Manager,

	21.2. If an athlete who has been allocated a Bipartite spot is injured or has been deselected for any
	reason, and is then going to be unable to compete at the event, then that place would have to be
	handed back to World Archery by the BPA, as this spot is not transferable, owing to it being
	allocated to a named athlete.
	21.3. If an athlete has been selected and they are then injured and unable to compete at the event, this
	spot can be reallocated if it is deemed that it will maximise Archery GB's medal opportunities in
	individual and team events, however there is no obligation to fill the quota places and the
	Performance Director / Para Programme Manager may elect to nominate fewer than the maximum
	permitted athletes.
	21.4. All selected athletes must declare any medications they are taking, in particular the use of any
	restricted medications, and submit these to the Archery GB Chief Medical Officer or equivalent for medical approval.
	21.5. An athlete may be de-selected from the Team in the event of non-compliance in training, failure to
	maintain form and fitness and / or adhere to mutually agreed Individual Performance Plan, a breach
	of responsibility to the Team or a violation of the Codes of Behaviour within the athlete handbook
	and/or BPA Team Members' Agreement. Prior to de-selection the athlete (or their appointed
	representative) must be presented with the opportunity to attend a removal interview with the

<u>Appendix 1:</u> International Paralympic Minimum Qualification Scores

The IPC recognises and respects the right of NPCs to establish their own national selection standards for determining the qualification of an athlete or team to compete in the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games. Such standards must be compliant with those established by the IPC as well as those of each respective International Federation. Any national selection standards must also align with confirmation dates and administrative deadlines of the Organising Committee of the Paralympic Games (OCOG). All athletes and teams are equally subject to their respective NPC's selection standards.

To be eligible for selection by an NPC, athletes must:

• Have achieved one (1) of the following Minimum Qualification Standards (MQS) for their respective sport class between 1 July 2023 and 1 July 2024
