



## **Screening and classification opportunities at the Disability Championships**

Archery GB Para Classifiers will be available at the Disability Championships to answer any questions or queries you may have about classification and the screening process.

If you are interested in being classified, we have identified the steps below:

**STEP ONE: please complete the '[Intake Form for Archery GB Para Classification](#)'** to help us guide your assessment appropriately, we firstly need further information about your archery journey.

**STEP TWO: Communication with an Archery GB classifier.** Once we have more information about your archery journey and your disability, we will be able to identify next steps. This maybe done via email, especially if further documentation is required, or you will be invited to book onto a 30-minute online meeting with one of our Archery Classifiers. This will provide an opportunity to discuss your specific situation, ask and answer questions, identify next steps regarding if a face-to-face assessment is required. We will email you and let you know potential dates of the online meetings and how you can book on.

**STEP THREE: Face to face assessment.** If it is agreed that a face-to-face assessment is required, we will let you know dates and opportunities available.

Classification in all para sport is based on the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) definition of disability and decisions relating to the types of disability allowed in sport. World Archery (WA) have applied the IPC principles to create the international classification framework. The UK classifications completed by Archery GB (AGB) classifiers are based as closely as possible on the WA framework with the aim that any GB archer who progresses to international classification should be allocated to the same sport class as their national classification.

**Please note: Even if it is identified that you are unable to be classified you can still enjoy archery and enter all UK based tournaments run under the authority of Archery GB. This includes using adaptive aids to shoot everything from your local club competition, the [Archery GB Disability Championships](#), through to County Championships and National Tour.**
